About LVA and Las Vegas

The Las Vegas Academy of the Arts (LVA) is a nationally recognized, award-winning magnet high school, serving approximately 1,720 students in Clark County, Nevada. Located in the center of the Las Vegas Founders District, LVA serves students from throughout the district in grades 9-12. LVA provides students the opportunity to pursue a conservatory in the areas of dance, music, theatre, or visual & media arts within which majors are available in dance, band, vocal, world jazz studies, guitar, mariachi, orchestra, piano, visual arts (2D, 3D, photography, film/video production, media arts & communication), technical theatre, and theatre. All students audition in their chosen performing major and/or prepare a portfolio.

LVA offers students an intellectually challenging learning experience and empowers them with 21st century skills and knowledge to compete successfully in the international workplace. LVA is a **FIVE-STAR** school according to the Performance Framework and boasts a 100% graduation rate. LVA offers more Advanced Placement exams than any other CCSD school. 87% of its graduating seniors enroll in a post-secondary institution, and last year, over \$20 million in scholarships were awarded.

LVA has received national, state, and local accolades. LVA has received twelve Grammy Signature School Awards for excellence in music programs and has been recognized by the International Network of Performing and Visual Arts schools as a STAR school. The U.S. Department of Education recognized LVA as a New American High School and honored LVA as a U.S. Blue Ribbon School, making it one out of only 17 high schools in the country to have received both prestigious awards. LVA has been designated a School of Distinction by Magnet Schools of America. LVA received the Outstanding Arts School Award from the Arts Schools Network (ASN), the nation's largest professional membership organization of specialized arts schools. Most recently, ASN awarded LVA Exemplary Status 2023-2028 for overall excellence and leadership in arts education. Niche.com awarded LVA an overall "A" grade.







The VISUAL & MEDIA ARTS Conservatory provides students with intensive instruction in two and threedimensional arts, photo, media arts & communication, and film/video production. Numerous show openings in oncampus gallery space and in the community provide students with opportunities to display their work in an academic setting. Students have access to state-of-the-art equipment and studios (Dark room, photo lab, kilns, pottery wheels, film studios, computer labs, cintiq tablets). The Visual & Media Arts Conservatory also has a working print shop called InHouse Design & Print, the only one in NV.

The **Performing Arts** program offers instruction in dance, technical theater, theater, vocal music, band, orchestra, jazz studies, guitar, mariachi ensemble, and piano. An aggressive production schedule provides students with many opportunities to perform in their chosen area of study, in both school and community productions/functions. The school has two large theaters as well as a black box space. It also has four dance studios, a multitude of individual music practice facilities and a recording studio.

In the **DANCE Conservatory**, students are introduced to a wide range of dance experiences and activities that will enhance basic movement technique and creativity. Instruction is given in <u>released-based modern dance</u>, Graham, Horton, <u>ballet</u>, <u>jazz</u>, <u>ballroom</u>, as well as <u>choreography</u>, dance history, and <u>improvisation</u>. Students dance in multiple shows throughout the year and two original dance dramas.

In the **THEATRE Conservatory**, students study both acting and technical theatre. The **technical theatre** program provides students with training in stage management, lighting, sets, sound, costume and set design and construction, through productions held in both large and small venues on campus. Using various forms of technology and class work that centers on proper terminology, safety, and backstage procedures, technical theatre majors develop and build skills necessary for the entertainment world.

The traditional **acting** program provides an overview of theatre and gives participants many opportunities to perform, from small classroom scenes to major productions. Basic acting skills are developed through improvisation, movement, and exercises for the actors. Acting students learn a broad cross-section of theatre theory and philosophy, and work toward placement in strong college theatre programs throughout the country. In addition, students have the opportunity to further refine their acting, singing and dancing skills through musical theater courses and productions. Recent productions at the Academy include: <u>42nd Street</u>, <u>Kiss Me</u>, <u>Kate</u>, <u>Antigone</u>, <u>Dogfight</u>, <u>Rent</u>, <u>Anything Goes!</u>, <u>Sense and Sensibility</u>, <u>Legally Blonde</u>, <u>Drowsy Chaperone</u> and <u>A Christmas Carol</u>.

In the **MUSIC Conservatory** students participate in comprehensive instruction in musicianship, music history, music technology and music theory. LVA Music boasts 60% of Honor Ensemble participants and has NV Command Performance winners every year.

The music conservatory has traveled internationally to Europe several times as well as annual trips to the largest cities in the U.S. The music conservatory offers majors in **band**, **guitar**, **mariachi**, **orchestra**, **piano**, **vocal**, **and jazz studies**.

The **band** program supports 3 concert bands as well as the wind/percussion section for 2 full orchestras. The top band regularly travels to national conferences and performances. The bands are divided into three placement sections: Varsity I, Varsity II, and Varsity III. The Wind Ensemble was invited to perform at the 2022 Midwest Band Clinic and the 2012, 2017, and 2023 Western International Band Clinic. They have also been invited to perform at the Band of America National Concert Band Festival three times (1999, 2005 and 2011).

The **vocal** program is for 250+ of Las Vegas's most talented vocal students. There are five choirs for which students can audition: Cantare, Bella Voz, Laudate, Konzert Chorale, and the Las Vegas Academy Singers, as well as participation in our "On Stage" and "Contemporary Voices" classes. Students in the vocal program regularly have opportunities to perform with artists like Hugh Jackman and on nationally-televised performances like the NFL Pro-Bowl, the NFL Draft and the 2023 NBC Primetime special, "A Very Barry Christmas" with Barry Manilow.

The **guitar** program at the Las Vegas Academy contains some of the most talented guitar players in the Las Vegas valley. As with the band program, the guitar program also contains Varsity I, Varsity II, and Varsity III levels. The department is a Gibson & Bender Award Winner.

The **mariachi** program draws students from all over Clark County who play in one of three mariachi ensembles with either a <u>violin</u>, <u>guitar/guitarron</u>, <u>vihuela</u>, <u>trumpet</u> or <u>harp</u>. It focuses on teaching the history and culture of the Mariachi, preserving the traditional music, and exploring the music of today's popular Mariachi ensembles. The Mariachi department has numerous awards and is a regular finalist in national competitions.

The **orchestra** program at Las Vegas Academy is one of the most selective and premier orchestras for talented orchestral students in the Las Vegas valley. There are currently four levels of orchestras with the top two involving winds and percussion. The Philharmonic has been invited to perform at the Midwest Clinic in 2009, 2014, and 2021.

The **piano** program has three levels of piano classes for each individual student at the Academy. The piano curriculum has four components: music history, keyboard, music theory, and performance. Students may participate in any of four solo and small ensemble recitals as well as performing in the Multiple Piano Festival scheduled in May.

The **jazz** program is one of the most decorated programs in the country with 22 DownBeat awards and a 13-time finalist at the Monterey Next Generation Jazz Festival. LVA Jazz students have performed several times at the Monterey Jazz Festival and The Midwest Clinic (2009, 2014, and 2021). Following a rigorous audition process, students are placed into one of three big bands. The jazz program also offers elective classes in big band, combos, and percussion.
